In 1970, renowned writer-composer-lyricist, Leslie Bricusse adapted the well-loved Dickens' short story *A Christmas Carol* into the hit screen musical *Scrooge*. This stage version, based on the film, with the addition of six new songs, had a hugely successful national tour before a season at the Dominion Theatre, London in 1996 starring Anthony Newley as the miserly Ebenezer Scrooge who repents his past life when visited by three successive Christmas spirits.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I mean Mr Whitfield, of musical/panto fame, who joined us last year for 'A Chorus of Disapproval'. It was he who quietly suggested a musical for November, and then knocked us all into some semblance of noteworthy and tone-worthy shape, in his own gently persuasive and immensely impressive fashion. Thank you, John, and untold thanks to all those who have given immeasurably of their time and dedication in so many ways! Without you all the show could not go on. We are truly grateful.

So, over to you now, our loyal audience. Our thanks, once again for your continued support of our ventures, and we hope you enjoy your evening. And hopefully, the only 'Bah...Humbugs!' we hear will be on the stage.
